Our MoDot Partners Make a Visit

Another important visit came on July 15th from the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), represented by Tom Blair, District Engineer along with others from his staff, Michelle Forneris, Assistant District Engineer, and Jennifer Wade, Area Director for the City of St. Louis

MoDOT has been a vital partner in the work of the Green House Venture since its beginning. Much of the program's activities take place on the Interstate 44 embankment that MoDOT manages along DeTonty Street between Thurman Avenue and 39th Street. They were instrumental in helping us build the guardrail that protects the students from I-44 traffic, and clearing the 3-acre expanse for the creation of our Embankment Greenway with the newly completed Terrace Garden. All of this activity has been granted by MoDOT through a lease and permit to the Venture.

Mr. Blair and his staff expressed how pleased they were with the work that has been accomplished on the Embankment Greenway, the main feature of the first phase of The GHV Campus, adding that this project is a prime example of how MoDOT partners with neighborhood groups on community projects.
